## **THE SECOND LESSON**

**2 Peter 1:16-21**

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

Dear People of All Saints:

I am excited to share that our Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Dr. Bonnie Perry has approved the use of a non-Episcopal hymnal for our congregation. *One Lord, One Faith, and One Baptism (1LFB)* was produced by GIA Publishing in 2018 and will now be available for use in our worship.

Renowned Episcopal musician and composer Dr. Carl MaultsBy was one of the editors. In a review he wrote for the Standing Committee on Liturgy and Worship’s blog, he stated: "1LFB as is can be used right now in all churches and denominations. In addition, it can serve as an addendum to not only the 1992 Lift Every Voice and Sing II but also the other existing Episcopal hymnal and supplements cited above without The Episcopal Church incurring the financial burden of collecting, securing rights, producing, testing, and distributing a new volume. One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism is a single hymnal whose contents readily lend themselves to reinforcing the revival energy, social justice ministry, and love tenets of diversity and inclusion of The Episcopal Church Jesus Movement."

The worship committee, as they assist me with planning liturgy here, will now be able to use it alongside the authorized resources we already have (Hymnal 1982, LEVAS, and the Book of Common Prayer) to continue planning dynamic worship that builds on the foundational principles of Anglican/Episcopal worship under the oversight of our Bishop.
